



The EMPEROR STRING QUARTET was formed in 1992. The following year the Quartet won several prizes: South East Arts "Young Concert Artists Platform", giving them concerts throughout Southern England; The Tunnel Prize, which introduced them to audiences in Scotland and the Edward Boyle Prize, which gave them their debut at the Wigmore Hall. In 1994 they were awarded the Menuhin Prize at the London String Quartet Competition and in 1995 they won First Prize, Mozart Prize and Contemporary Music Prize at the prestigious Evian/Bordeaux International String Quartet Competition, thereby introducing them to audiences in Europe.

Being conducted by Michael Tippett dressed in a flared powder blue suit and bright yellow trainers certainly made an impression on members of the TIPPETT QUARTET. Sir Michael Tippett died in 1998 and was such an inspirational musician that when the Tippett Quartet was formed in the same week, they decided to take his name.

The quartet made its Wigmore Hall debut in 1998, they have since performed at the BBC Proms, Cheltenham Festival, Three Choirs Festival, Chichester Festivities, Presteigne Festival, Spitalfields Festival, Dartington International Summer School and Lincoln International Festival. They have also performed at King's Place, Purcell Room, Queen Elizabeth Hall, Bridgewater Hall, The Sage, Gateshead and regularly return to Wigmore Hall. The quartet frequently appears on BBC Radio 3.

The HEATH QUARTET is rapidly emerging as an exciting and original voice on the international chamber music scene. Selected for representation by YCAT in 2008 they immediately went on to win 1st Prize at the Tromp International Competition in Eindhoven and 2nd Prize at the Haydn International Competition in Vienna. In 2011 they were awarded a prestigious Borletti-Buitoni Special Ensemble Scholarship and in the same year undertook complete Beethoven Quartet cycles at the Fàcyl Festival in Salamanca Spain and at Greyfriars Church in Edinburgh. The Quartet were presented with a Bank of Scotland Herald Angel Award after unanimous praise from The Herald's music critics in Edinburgh.

Over the last two years the Quartet has given recitals at major festivals and venues throughout Europe including Barbican, Bridgewater Hall, Sage Gateshead, Perth Concert Hall and Queen's Hall Edinburgh, the Musikverein, Konzerthaus, Esterhazy Palace (Vienna) and Vara Konserthus (Sweden). They have given BBC Radio 3 broadcasts from Birmingham Town Hall, the Cosmo Rodewald Hall in Manchester and Bath Festival and been resident Quartet at the Brighton Dome. In 2010 the Quartet recorded their first CD at the Muziekcentrum Frits Philips and gave recitals in Italy and Shanghai.
